

SHORT COURSE - MANAGING PUBLIC SECURITY AND THE RULE OF LAW

18TH–21ST MAY 2010

The Centre for Security Sector Management at Cranfield University is now accepting applications for a 4 day short course in *Managing Public Security and the Rule of Law*

The justice sector provides the backbone for internal security processes and procedures and encompasses a number of separate state institutions to provide security for the people. This course will examine the way in which justice sectors are formed and managed to deliver security for the people.

The course covers the core roles and responsibilities of individual institutions, the different national approaches to the delivery of security and justice, the distinctions between different legal systems and accountability, transparency and oversight of the justice sector. The course will assess international law and institutions, transitional justice

mechanisms and restorative justice and the approaches to delivery of non-state justice. The course will also look at various case studies of post conflict justice reform in transitional countries

The short course comes with full Cranfield University accreditation equivalent to one post-graduate module.
